





### RINSKE BOUWMAN

## Hard Skin

Dutch Sarlag grew up in Mongolia and returns to Utrecht as a student. Looking for a part-time job, she applies at a large supermarket. There, she is told she can work in the refrigerated freezer department: she is used to the cold anyway. During the long days at work, she models half-melted frozen foods into meat figurines and keeps herself calm by listing her favourite facts. It is clear that Sarlag carries a great sadness with her but she is especially talented at getting it out of the way.

A payment is easily made, either by wire or bank bills. For a loan you knock on the door of a bank office. We think all of that is just normal. A world with only metallic money and without ample credit is something from a distant and dark past. Central banks have played a defining role in the creation of our monetary system. They are the ultimate lender of credit, putting banknotes into circulation and pursuing monetary policies that support the economy. But their activities extend beyond these roles. For instance, they finance government, contribute to higher income and wealth inequality, and encourage financial risk-taking. It is mostly unknown to the general public that the consequences do not always have a positive outcome.

*Europe's Shadow Government* focuses on the European Central Bank (ECB). This book not only discusses the institution's creation, but also how the ECB de facto, directs society, how this happens without democratic control, and what measures could be taken to remedy this.

When they return in February 1945, the rubble of war is cleared away. But the war has a lasting aftermath. By the time the war is decades past, Polish Jews are prevented from living in their homeland. Stefan decides to flee again. This time for good.



In 1969, he settled in Nijmegen, where he worked as a surgeon and later as a professor at Radboud University. He was internationally active and renowned in his field. He speaks regularly at high schools about his flight.

### Following the footsteps of the Surinamese freedom fighter

The year 2025 marks Suriname's fiftieth anniversary of independence.

Around 1730, a highly pregnant black woman flees the horrors of slavery and gives birth to her son Boni in the Surinamese swamp. He will grow up to become the leader of the Maroons: for over thirty years, he and his followers heroically resist colonial rule. As a teenager, Tessa Leuwsha first read about this mythical warrior in We Slaves of Surinam. From then on, she is intrigued by him: who was he, and what is the story of his courageous mother? What did his actions mean then and now, how does his legacy continue to impact her own life? 
