The Holland America Line and Transatlantic Migration

It's 1891 when George Reuchlin sails to New York City on the newest ship of the Holland America Line, the Rotterdam-based steamship company cofounded by his father Otto Reuchlin. George is only sixteen, but he is already destined to follow in his father's footsteps. More then twenty years later, in 1912, he waves his family goodbye as he boards the Titanic. Like so many others, George does not survive its sinking. His shocking and untimely death has a tremendous impact on his family and the world beyond.

Between George's first and last trip across the ocean, approximately thirteen million people – including many Jews from East-Europe and Russia – emigrated from Europe to America. Together with other European steamship companies, the Holland America Line played a crucial part in this exodus. Without the competitive urge to build the biggest possible ships, migration to the United States could never have taken place on such a massive scale.

The story of George Reuchlins' life is inextricably linked to this European Exodus. While there may have been an ocean of separation between his life as a first-class passenger and the lives of the emigrants in third class, they all had one thing in common: a desire for a home of their own.


In Birkenau

Among the passengers on the last train from Westerbork to Auschwitz was Rosa de Winter-Levy, along with her husband and daughter. Immediately upon arrival in Auschwitz, Rosa was forcibly separated from her husband. She ended up in Birkenau, where her daughter, too, was taken from her. In Birkenau, Rosa befriended Edith, Anne Frank's mother, who had also been separated from her family. Edith died in Rosa's arms; Rosa herself miraculously escaped death. She lay in the hospital barracks when the camp, abandoned by the ss, was liberated by the Russians.

For a long time, she anxiously awaited news of her husband and daughter. Months after the liberation, she finally held her daughter in her arms again; her husband turned out to have been killed. That same summer, Rosa began writing an account of the horrors she had witnessed. The resulting work, *In Birkenau*, is an exceptionally direct and deeply moving testimony of her experience.



ROSA DE WINTER-LEVY was born on 9 June 1905 in Gelsenkirchen, Germany. Her parents died of the Spanish flu, after which young Rosa moved to the Netherlands. In 1927, she married Emanuel de Winter, who owned a butcher's shop in Zutphen. A year later, their only child Judy was born. Rosa de Winter-Levy died in 1985.

How Cars Changed Our World

In 1885, Carl Benz designed and produced the very first combustion engine car. Only 150 years later, in 2035, its entire production is subject to a EU mandated stop.

Initially mainly a toy for rich adventurers seeking the thrill of speed and a flirtation with death, over time cars became the jewel of consumer society. They offered their owner freedom and flexibility: cars allowed people to go on holidays and discover nature and enabled city dwellers to move to green suburbs. People began to live away from where they worked and shopped, and the socially mixed city gave way to a larger divide in classes.

In *Autopia*, Peter Giesen shows how cars completely changed our world. He describes how entrepreneurs and designers like Henry Ford, André Citroën and Ferdinand Porsche turned them into mass products, tells the stories of poets and artists like Bertolt Brecht and Elvis Presley, who fell for the automobile's charm, and casts a glance into the future. Peter Giesen writes a requiem for the internal combustion engine car, the machine that was the focus of our dreams for a century and a half.


The Burnout Paradox

The History of an Elusive Societal Disease

A critical insight of the scientific and historical views on burnouts

Some say burnouts do not exist, others state that burnouts are an epidemic in Western societies. There is some truth in both views. Medically speaking, there are no indicators that make burnout a disease, yet many people nowadays experience real exhaustion. The phenomenon points to a social problem. Experts and therapists work with contradictory descriptions and treatments. The rise of burnout can indeed partly be explained by its vagueness: the concept applies to more and more situations. That makes it even more difficult for healthcare providers, because there is not one workable description. How do we get a grip on this elusive phenomenon?

The Burnout Paradox sharpens our view on contemporary burnout precisely by mapping its forgotten past. Learning how the concept originated helps in comprehending how it has grown into a social issue of epidemic proportions and in understanding our society – and, by extension, ourselves.







You always check if the lights are off when you leave a room. That sure is well-intentioned, but what does it really matter in the bigger picture of the global energy supply? Activists, feminists, anti-racists and socialists have their hearts in the right place, but by no means always achieve the goal they had in mind. In fact, with the best of intentions, much harm has already been done.

Well-Intentioned contains thirty examples of irrational dogmas that miss the mark. The book is confrontational and sometimes controversial, but also compulsory reading for those who really want to achieve results as politicians, activists, socially engaged citizens or conscious consumers. For those who care about the environment, stand up for animal rights, sometimes buy local (fair trade) food, avoid products with palm oil or clothes made in sweatshops and for those who want less crime, less co2 and who care about safety, justice or health. In short, read this book if you want to effectively make this world a better place.

STIJN BRUERS holds a PhD in natural sciences and another one in moral philosophy, next to a Master's degree in policy economics. He is a rational ethicist, researcher and activist who has been committed to good causes for many years. Bruers is also the president and co-founder of Effective Altruism Belgium, an organisation that uses rational thinking and scientific evidence to do as much good as possible.






